Increase Sense of Belonging

- Having choice in assignments
- Staff treating students with respect
- In-school suspensions
- Having a safe person to talk with about issues
- · When staff look for reason for student behaviour
- Students taking responsibility for their "wrong" actions and given the chance to repair

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Decrease Sense of Belonging

- Staff not treating students with respect
- Not creating learning opportunities that allow students to be successful
- Not teaching online safe behaviour
- Inequity of student flexible learning (only happens for some)
- Gender groupings ex. Boys and girls lineups
- Grouping by "levels"
- Teachers that communicate to parents through email for a "paper trail"



What are issues that impact school safety and belonging

- Washroom safety
- Long lunch line ups
- Not given choice in activities (e.g. square dancing)
- Cell Phone Policy
- Hat Policy
- Safe space to share ideas and views
- Limited lunch space

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Washroom Safety

- Problem:
 - o Vaping in the washroom and unsafe behaviour
 - o Suspensions and taking vapes is not working
 - Vandalism in bathrooms
- Solution:
 - o Person needs to repair and fix their action
 - o Have alternative space for vaping
 - Substance use prevention programs



Limited Choice


- Problem:
- Square Dancing
 - Not OK with being touched by others
 - o Don't feel safe when a partner is chosen for you
 - o Don't separate by "gender"
- Solution:
 - Use pennies to separate (red and blue shirts)
 - Have choice in participation
 - o Feeling of inequity in choice
 - Have more choice in assignments

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Cell Phone Policy

- Problem:
 - o When phones are taken, no longer have schedule
 - No working clocks
 - o Inappropriate sites to browse
 - o Distraction for some students in class
 - Staff using phones (double standards)
- Solution:
 - o Teach proper use of phone
 - Warning before taken
 - o Block unsafe sites
 - o Once class work is finished, phones are allowed




- Solution:
 - o Don't have policy: personal expression

Hoods covering facial features

o Most schools already fixed this problem

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Student voices

- Problem:
 - o Student voices don't get heard
 - o Feel like there is no-one to talk to
- Solution:
 - o Student forum already helped with this problem
 - o Safe place to talk about issues without judgement
 - o Place where you can make a complaint
 - o Have it at school and district level

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Respect

- Problem:
 - Staff not treating student with respect
 - o Calling home and we don't know why
 - Staff not understanding the "bigger picture" (ex: homelife)
- Solution:
 - Having more enforcement to stop racism and homophobic comments
 - o Having conversations and talking with students about issues
 - o Communicating with students before parents



Long Lunch Lines

- Problem:
 - Students are stuck in the lineup for the entire lunch and then don't have time to eat
 - o Begin to close before you can order food
- Solution:
 - o Divide the line up into two separate spaces
 - o One hot food line up
 - \circ One cold food line up

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Transitions

- Problem:
 - New environment (physical space/students/teachers)
 - Unfamiliar routines/schedules
 - Not having a feeling of belonging
 - More people and larger spaces
- Solution:
 - o Clubs to help students transition
 - o Tours for new students
 - o Support person/adult they can trust
